FROM THE OFFICE

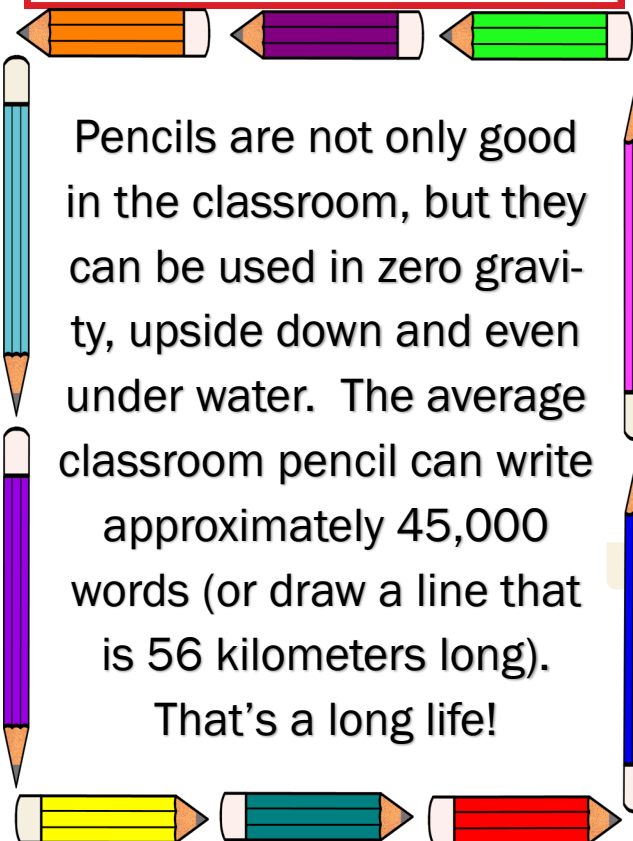
Our office hours are Monday–Friday 7:10am to 2:30pm
