

DHHS Dress Code Policy



The purpose of the dress code is to promote a safe learning environment.
Clothing choices or hairstyles that distract from the learning environment will not be allowed.

<p><u>HEAD</u></p> <p>NO caps, visors, hoods, bandanas or other head gear.</p> <p>Extremes in hair styles or colors that are a distraction or disruption are not acceptable.</p>	<p>ACCEPTABLE</p> 	<p>NOT ACCEPTABLE</p> 
<p><u>UPPER GARMENT</u></p> <p>All garments must cover shoulder to shoulder. NO undergarments may be showing on the shoulder.</p> <p>All garments must be long enough to clearly overlap the beltline or stay tucked in. NO Bare midriiffs</p> <p>NO halter tops, tank tops, spaghetti straps or muscle shirts.</p> <p>NO open back shirts that show bare skin or undergarments.</p> <p>Garments must NOT display profanity, suggestive slogans, or promote illegal substances.</p>	<p>ACCEPTABLE</p> 	<p>NOT ACCEPTABLE</p> 
<p><u>LOWER GARMENT</u></p> <p>Undergarments and the buttocks must remain entirely covered.</p> <p>Dresses, skirts, and shorts must be at least finger length on the thigh</p> <p>NO pants or shorts can have rips or tears above the mid thigh.</p>	<p>ACCEPTABLE</p> 	<p>NOT ACCEPTABLE</p>
