- 1. Be on time and ready to start class when the bell rings and get needed teaching supplies.
- 2. Be a good teacher-use manipulatives, visuals and games to make learning fun-they CAN learn!!
- 3. Be a good friend-treat students with respect and love-What do you have in common with them?
- 4. Stay with the students and keep them safe at all times!
- 5. Be a GREAT EXAMPLE! Follow all school and classroom rules.
