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Introduction: It is an honor to be your teacher. I look forward to making this our most rewarding year ever. You will be expected to participate, be on time, be prepared, and be an active contributing student of the class. **I expect assignments to be completed and done to the best of each student's ability, while at the same time challenging you to improve each day.**

U.S. History Course Description: 8th grade U.S. History covers events and issues from the time periods of the first Americans through the post-Civil War Reconstruction era. Topics will include pre-Columbian America, exploration, colonization, the Revolutionary War, constitutional issues, nation-building, western migration and expansion, the Civil War, and Reconstruction. We will also study the role of geography in shaping historical events and the relationships between events of different time periods, including today. The main goal of this class is to understand and analyze the events in the history of the United States and then evaluate their effects on us today.
