

Enterprise Athletic Hall of Fame Constitution

Mission Statement of the Enterprise Athletic Hall of Fame:

The mission of the Enterprise Athletic Hall of Fame is to honor Enterprise High School athletes, coaches, administrators, and distinguished contributors whose achievements and involvement in athletics have brought outstanding recognition and esteem to themselves, and to Enterprise High School.

By-Laws

A-The Selection Committee:

The committee will consist of 5 members from the following categories.

1. Athletic Director of Enterprise High School who will serve as Chairman of the Board.
2. Current teaching staff member at Enterprise High School (minimum 1)
3. Current coaching staff members at Enterprise High School (minimum 1)
4. Community members and/or alumni (minimum 1)
5. 1 other member.

Committee members will be nominated by the chairperson by January 1 of each year. All members are expected to vote and attend meetings when available. All members are required to sign a confidentiality agreement.

B-Factors for consideration: Student-Athletes

1. Superior accomplishments as a varsity athlete at EHS, such as, but not limited to: State MVP, All-State Award, College Athletic Scholarship, etc.
2. A minimum of 5 years out of high school or is deceased.
3. Continuing athletic excellence at the collegiate, national, amateur or professional level.
4. Serves as a role model before and after graduation from EHS.
5. Academic and/or post-college career accomplishments.
6. Other factors considered by the committee.

C-Factors for consideration: Coaches,

1. Significant contributions to promote athletics, taking into account longevity, and overall coaching records.
2. State and Region Championships
3. A coach may have worked with several individual champions over the years in his/her sport, such as track, wrestling, cross country, however not won any team championships.
4. Serves as a role model
5. Other factors considered by the committee.

D-Factors for consideration: Administrators and Special Contributors

1. Significant contributions over a period of time to promote athletic programs at Enterprise High.
2. Serves as a role model.
3. Other factors considered by the committee.

E- Recognized Sports at Enterprise High School include: The definition of recognized sports at Enterprise High School would state that a sport must be competitive in nature and have the option of winning a team or individual state title. The following sports are recognized at this time:

Baseball, Boys Basketball, Cross Country, Drill Team, Football, Girls Basketball, Rodeo, Softball, Track, Volleyball, and Wrestling. The list is subject to change upon addition of sports at Enterprise High School

F-Nomination Process:

Candidates may be nominated by anyone. Nomination forms may be obtained from the high school office or from the school website. In order for a candidate to be considered, the nomination form must be COMPLETELY filled out. Nomination forms must be submitted to the committee by April 1 for the fall induction class. In this first year, nomination forms must be submitted by September 15, 2015.

Once a candidate is nominated, they would remain in the pool of nominees for 5 years. If they are not elected to the Hall during that 5 year period, they would be removed from the pool. In both cases, once the nominee is removed from the pool, they would need to be nominated again to be considered. The list of nominees in the pool will appear on the school web-site.

G-Selection Process:

All former Enterprise High School student-athletes, coaches, administrators and special contributors are eligible for selection into the athletic hall of fame.

- Each nominee's application will be reviewed by each committee member.
- Nominees will go through two voting procedures to become inductees.
- Two members per year will be inducted in the Hall of Fame, with the exception of the first year where up to 5 members may be inducted.
- In the first round of voting, members will vote for their top 10 choices. The votes will be prioritized. The first vote will receive 10 points, 2nd choice 9 points, etc.
- In the first year, the top 8 vote getters will go the final round. In every other year, the top 4 vote getters will make the final round.
- In the first round of voting, each committee member will submit their votes to the board to be counted. The chairman will present a list of finalists to the committee and keep track of nominees who did not receive enough votes to be considered a finalist. Each committee member will then rank the finalists in order and present their list to the chairperson for tabulation. Once tabulated, and if there are no ties, the top 2 vote getters will become elected to Hall of Fame. The first year the top 4 vote getters will enter the Hall of Fame.
- In determining a class for a given year, it is the committee's obligation to ensure the class is representative of all eligible groups to ensure a well-balanced hall of fame.
- In case of a tie, the oldest member will enter the Hall of Fame with the tied member being automatically in the following year.

H- Presentation Ceremony

The presentation will occur each year prior to the first boys varsity home basketball game.

Each Hall of Fame member will receive a special plaque with its duplicate being placed on the Hall of Fame Wall.

For the initial year, Robert Holt and Grant Clove will be presented with their plaques along with the other 4 recipients. (Robert Holt and Grant Clove were placed in the Hall many years ago)
